God, who has been our help, has also been our hope. God has been Calva-

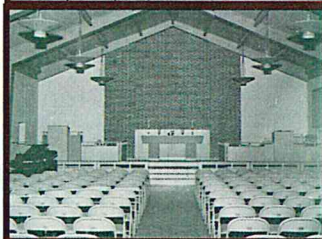

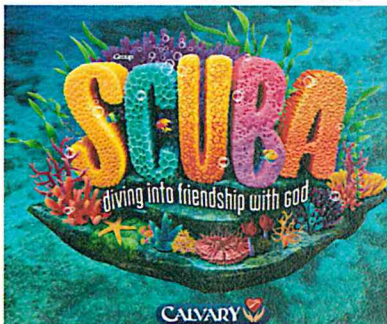

The Missions Committee is pleased to provide Angel presents to several organizations this Christmas Season. The gifts provided will benefit the following:

Bethesda Mission Women's Shelter has offered a place of healing, change and hope for women in need of addiction recovery, safety and stability for over 34 years. They offer a variety of programs to help those searching for their purpose in this world. Their new facilities accommodate 50+ women and children.

Calvary Kids Day Care is a non-profit Christian childcare center that strives for a family-like environment. Calvary Kids serves children ages 6 weeks to 5 year with a Before and After School Program as well as a School Age Summer Camp.

Camp Penn is one of four camps operated by the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church. It provides seasonal retreats in the months of April, May, August, September and October. Weekly summer camps in June, July and August are available for children ages 6 through 18 which are set in a Christian environment with a variety of themes and events. Since 1946, Camp Penn has been providing relevant and relational Christian, educational, non-profit, and volunteer programs.

Harrisburg Area Police Athletic/Activities League (HAPAL) provides youth initiatives and activities throughout the year. Mentoring through Sports and Life Learners are the main initiatives from which all programs/activities stem. HAPAL Sports instruction centers on positive mentoring, education, character development, positive values, diversity, and re-

sponsible behavior. The Life Learners Initiative is at the core of all programs/activities offered by HAPAL, along with the goal of bridging the gaps between our mentees and law enforcement in hopes of reducing crime and recidivism in our communities.

Paxton Ministries provides affordable housing and support services to adults in need with Christ-like love. They care for adults challenged with poverty, mental illness, and intellectual disabilities. Their housing options offer a safe, comfortable, and supportive home where adults in need are treated with dignity and respect and where each person's unique gifts are celebrated. By working together as a family of residents, staff, volunteers, supporters, and community partners, they strive to provide housing, help, and healing in the name of Christ.

Penn National Race Track Chaplaincy – Although most do not realize it, on the backside of a racehorse track there is a community of people that work and even live at the track. This community is made up of people that come from all walks of life but are brought together because of their love of horses and a passion for the sport. The main purpose of their job is to care for the horses with incredible devotion and love so the horses can run their best race. But who will care for the people in this unique community? Who will lift them up with compassion in a time of need, and also be their biggest supporter in times of happiness? Who is the spiritual backbone of this community? The answer may surprise you – it's the track chaplain. Through the Penn National Race Track Chaplaincy faith, friends, and fellowship is provided.

UNITED METHODIST STUDENT DAY

United Methodist Student Day was the original Special Sunday founded by United Methodist Church Sunday Schools who collected offerings to help advance education for their children. The fund was originally established in 1872 as the Children's Fund. Today, United Methodist Student Day Sunday has the same purpose, calling upon the denomination to support their students as they prepare for life by adding knowledge to their faith.

Every year, General Board of Higher Education and Ministry awards an average of \$5.5 million in financial aid to United Methodist students. The offering taken on United Methodist Student Day is one opportunity to support these scholarships. Every dollar – yes 100% - received goes towards supporting and educating a new generation of principled Christian leaders for the church and the world. Supporting this Special Sunday is truly an investment in our future.

Currently, there are over 70 scholarships available for undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral United Methodist students. Financial support for all General Board of Higher Education and Ministry scholarships come from five primary sources: 63% from endowments; 22% from wills and annuities; 13% from United Methodist Special Sundays and 1% from online gifts and fiduciary income. All donations received empower and encourage our students that we are investing in them and our future.
