



Ephesians 1:15-2:10 (NIV)

For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. "A.L.I.V.E. in Christ Together"

Series – Ephesians: A.L.I.V.E. in a Fallen World Rev. Randall G. Bennett, Jr.

Background to Ephesians: The Apostle Paul arrived in Ephesus in A.D. 52 and evangelized there for two years (Acts 19:10). Paul performed numerous miracles during this time (Acts 19:11-12), demonstrating the power of Jesus' name over demon possession (Acts 19:13-16), magic practices (Acts 19:17-19), and the worship of Artemis (Acts 19:23-41). As a result, "the word of the Lord grew in power" (Acts 19:20). When Paul departed, he left behind a thriving and healthy church, as noted in Acts 20:16-38 during his journey to Jerusalem. Paul's letter to the Ephesians was one of his later epistles, along with Philippians and Colossians (collectively known as "the prison letters") because he composed them from his Roman prison cell.

Theme – Counter-Cultural: The Ephesian Christians lived in a society steeped in idolatry, spiritual darkness, and cultural hostility to their faith. At the heart of the epistle is the question of identity: How does the Church overcome the influence of the culture surrounding her? Paul's answer is clear: through the immeasurable power of the Living God, the Church can live *in* the culture but not *of* the culture by embracing God's grace as the source of their identity and power.

Series Acronym – A.L.I.V.E.: Each week we will utilize the acronym as a teaching tool.

Today's Sermon (1:15–2:10) explores the transformative power of God's grace that brings spiritual life where there was once death. In a world marked by spiritual brokenness and division, the message highlights that being "alive" in Christ is not an individual experience, but a collective, dynamic reality shared among believers.

Awakened by Grace (Ephesians 2:1–5; 1:18): We were once dead in sin, but because of God's great love and mercy, we are made alive with Christ. Grace awakens us to a new reality, transforming our spiritual death into life.

Living in Unity (Ephesians 1:15–16; 2:5–6; 2:10): Our new life in Christ unites us as one body, displaying love for one another and reflecting the unity that God desires for His people.

Identified with Christ (Ephesians 1:13; 1:22–23): Our identity is not rooted in our past or performance but in Christ, who has marked us with the seal of the Holy Spirit, claiming us as His own.

Victorious through His Power (Ephesians 1:19–21; 2:6): The resurrection power that raised Christ from the dead also empowers us to live victoriously over sin and fear, both now and in eternity.

Equipped to Witness (Ephesians 2:10; 1:17): God has created us in Christ to do good works, equipping us to share His grace through our words, actions, and love.
