"The Trailhead: Contemplative Prayer" Series: Pathway of Prayer Rev. Randall G. Bennett, Jr.

Scripture Focus: "Hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done..." (Matthew 6:9b-10)

Background: The Gospel of Matthew was written for a Jewish audience to demonstrate that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Jesus is portrayed as the divine Son and perfect image of God the Father throughout the Gospel. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus centers His teaching on righteousness not as public performance, but as an authentic relationship with God. Prayer, along with fasting and almsgiving, formed one of the core expressions of Jewish piety. Jesus redefines these practices as the fruit of an authentic relationship with God. When Jesus taught the Lord's Prayer, He offered not only words to recite, but a transformative way of relating to God: intimately, confidently, and with childlike trust. It is a prayer both personal and corporate: we address God not as "my Father" but "our Father," reminding us that life with God is always life shared in community.

Sermon Idea: The Pathway of Prayer begins with *The Plan*: trusting Our Father and listening for His voice. Next, it moves to *The Trailhead* as we look for the first "white blaze:" God's holiness and our alignment to His mission. To "hallow" God's name means more than reverent speech; it's a call to live in holy wonder. Martin Luther wrote that this is both a declaration of praise and a plea that God's name, "be honored in us and everywhere." John Wesley insisted this petition calls us to holiness of heart and life. "The holiness of God is not merely to be admired but to be imitated." "Thy kingdom come" means seeking Christ's rule both personally and in society. "Thy will be done," challenges us to release our agendas, so that our lives become aligned to God's will and purpose. Before we speak of bread or burdens, we are reminded: prayer is about wonder, surrender, and alignment with God's mission.

Gather at the Trailhead: Reverence before Requests

Follow the First White Blaze: "Hallowed Be Your Name"

Stay on the Path: "Your Kingdom Come, Your Will Be Done"

This Week: Expand your silence before prayer to 5 minutes. Then practice contemplating only these phrases of The Lord's Pray." 'Our Father in heaven/hallowed be your name/your kingdom come/your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Let God speak next and write what you hear in a listening journal.
