The Questions You Asked

Thank you, Calvary,
for your questions!

When we invited you to submit questions about faith, the Bible, Church, God, life, death, suffering – and everything in between – I wasn't quite sure what to expect. What we received was an abundance of thoughtful, honest, curious, and sometimes wonderfully challenging questions. **Your curiosity warms my heart!**

In fact, y'all submitted so many questions that we have enough material for multiple sermon series. Rather than trying to answer everything all at once, we're going to take our time and let these questions lead us into deeper Scriptural conversations about what it means to follow Jesus.

The questions cover a remarkable range. Some ask about what it means to belong to the church and to one another. Others wrestle with faith, doubt, and what it means to trust God. There are questions about how our faith changes us and calls us to confront injustice. There are also deeply personal questions about suffering, forgiveness, prayer, healing, death, heaven, and what happens when life doesn't turn out the way we hoped. And, of course, there are questions that invite us to explore the Bible and some of its more difficult passages. Please know that every question will be answered in the months ahead.

I will begin answering your questions this October with a three-part

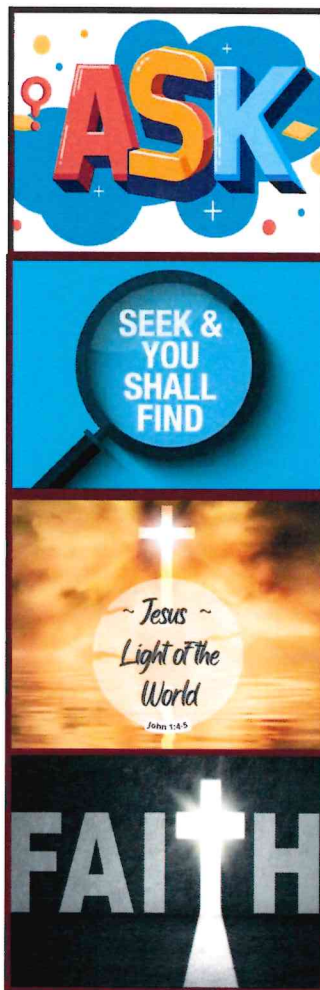

series entitled, "*The Light of the World.*" What do Jesus' familiar words from the Sermon on the Mount mean, and how do we apply them to these questions:

- **October 11:** "*With all the turmoil going on in America now, how hard will it be to bring people back to God?*"
- **October 18:** "*How do we take the teachings of Christ from the pews to the society in which we are privileged to live to effect public policies which can extend the teachings of Jesus to more brothers and sisters than our congregation itself can effect?*"
- **October 25:** "*Would it be possible to have a service on 'the service'?*" (We'll spend the entire worship service exploring why we worship the way we do: what each part means, why it happens when it does, and how the pieces fit together to form expressive worship.)

Y'all...this is just the beginning. More of your questions will be answered in November and in the months that follow.

Thank you for trusting us with your questions. Keep asking them, because faith isn't the absence of doubt; it's the grace of learning to welcome curiosity.

ADVENT DEVOTIONAL

Emmanuel in the Ordinary

Christmas is the celebration of Emmanuel – God with us – and Advent prepares us for His arrival. In Jesus, God did not remain distant from human life but entered the ordinary “stuff” of our world as a newborn child. He had a family, home, meals, and traditions.

For this year’s Advent devotional, we invite you to reflect on the ordinary things that have become meaningful to you at Christmas.

Perhaps it is an object, person, place, food, song, decoration, photograph, or a family tradition. Maybe it is something you have encountered year after year, or something that has taken on new meaning because of a particular season of your life.

What’s something ordinary that is special to you at Christmas? What makes it meaningful, and what does it help you remember, appreciate, or celebrate?

Your reflection should be 150–200 words, and it need not be explicitly theological. Simply tell your story and share why this ordinary thing matters to you.

RECYCLING & DUMPSTER REMINDER

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster. There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag. Allowable recyclables are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). Thank you for your cooperation!

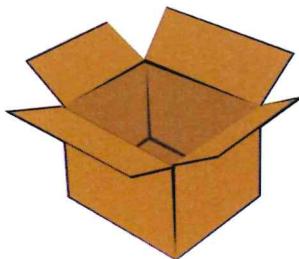
COLLEGE CARE PACKAGES

HOW WE PROVIDE SUPPORT AT CALVARY

With so much ongoing need and an increase in requests for assistance, we are providing you with information on church policies and how we provide help.

Does Calvary provide help with rental assistance?

No. Calvary has committed to assisting our community through the Cupboard at Calvary (our food pantry) which serves over 100 families every two weeks. We also provide emergency one-time food bags with documentation through the church office.

We are proud to be a partner church with Christian Churches United (CCU) who specialize in homeless prevention services, rental assistance, and emergency shelter needs. CCU staff are trained in social work and have up-to-date information on resources available. They have the appropriate intake process in place to help people through the re-housing or prevention process.

Does the church have a policy about what to do if someone is asking for financial, housing, or food help?

Yes. All requests should be taken to a pastor or the church office where we will walk with the individual to provide resources we directly help with or get them in touch with the correct organizations who are trained and resourced to deal with their individual needs. We do not allow solicitation of church members. In alignment with our Safe Sanctuary Policy, if you encounter someone at the church seeking assistance please direct them to a pastor or the church office so we can get them in touch with the proper resources for long-term support.

Best Practices for Requests for Money

In general, the best practices for addressing needs where people are asking for money is to go through organizations that have the proper training and resources to offer help. There are many opportunities to do-

nate to established organizations through church committees who have vetted the organizations. All requests should be directed to a pastor or the church office.

We also live in a world where there are many active scams. Oftentimes, scammers are able to send emails and texts that resemble pastors or church staff. As a reminder, no one from the church will ever contact you through personal email or text and ask you for donations or gift cards. All official church communications can be found in the newsletter, bulletin, or church-wide email blast. If you ever receive a communication and have a question, please do not hesitate to reach out to the church office to verify the request.

ALTAR FLOWER DELIVERY

Flowers on the altar enhance our weekly worship service. They could also enhance the life of a shut-in member or friend if someone would take it to their home. Bob Little will coordinate a weekly delivery of flowers to nursing homes, hospitals or homes. If you are willing to assist in this mission, please contact the church office. Bob may call you occasionally on a Monday to see if you're able to do it at that time. Each delivery of flowers will represent your Christian love in action, and may provide a moment of Christian Fellowship.

LAMS VOLUNTEERS

At Calvary we have love and care for our LAMs (Limited Activity Members). Our volunteers are assigned a LAM and visit at least once a month. They also send cards and touch base with phone calls. This reminds our LAMs that they are loved. Volunteer to love our LAMs through visitation, phone ministry, or card ministry by contacting Pastor Deb.

CARING CUPBOARD FOR CALVARY'S YOUTH

We are asking for your support in providing meals for the Youth Group (12—15 people) on Wednesday evenings. Meals can either be prepared by you or frozen items such as chicken tenders, fries, ravioli, soup, tacos, salads, and dessert. Drinks do not need to be provided. Drop off times are by 3:30 PM for frozen items needing preparation and heating by leaders and 5:15 PM for meals ready to eat. Sign up in the hallway outside The Square. If you are unable to provide a meal, monetary donations are also accepted to help cover the cost of drinks, etc. Contact Kelley in the office with questions.

We are also looking for donations of pre-packaged individual serving size breakfast pastries and cookies for Sunday School (Little Bites Muffins, Granola Bars, Cookies, etc.). Items can be placed in the Drop Zone. Contact Kelley in the office with any questions.
